

## UP MS House Rules

1. The campus buildings of the Medical School serve education, research and health care, therefore general community behaviour and standards are expected (orderliness, tidiness, quiet communication).
2. Rules of general behaviour do not differ from those of any cultivated behaviour expected in families and other communities.
3. During the period of health crisis or epidemiological preparedness ordered in connection with the coronavirus epidemic, entering the premises of the university shall be bound to a definite goal (e.g. teaching, research, work, studying, administration, sports activity, attending events) and be limited to the duration of achieving that particular goal.
4. During the period of health crisis or epidemiological preparedness ordered in connection with the coronavirus epidemic, only healthy individuals who do not show any symptoms of coronavirus infection shall enter (at their own risk) the university's buildings and visit events and classes.
5. During the period of health crisis or epidemiological preparedness ordered in connection with the coronavirus epidemic, every individual shall wear personal protective equipment that covers the mouth and the nose inside university buildings (e.g. surgical mask, scarf, etc.) and every individual shall comply with the hygienic safety measures.
6. In line with Act No. XLI of 2011 on smoking in health care facilities, smoking is allowed only in designated areas, and is strictly prohibited in buildings, near the entrances (5 m) and public areas. Any person found guilty of breaching the ban may be subject to a fine. Cigarette butts should be discarded into pre-cast concrete urns in the designated smoking areas.
7. Loud or noisy behaviour is not allowed in common and teaching areas since it disturbs communication with each other and teaching (or other events like concerts, lectures, presentations).
8. Entrances, stairways and the road leading to the stairways are escape routes. Keep them clear at all times. Sitting, eating, drinking and smoking are all prohibited in the escape routes.
9. After finishing meals and drinks waste food is to be discarded in litter bins, recyclable waste, such as paper, drinking cartons, plastic bottles and metal boxes are to be discarded in the selective waste containers.

10. In the campus site of the Medical School parking is allowed if it does not block the way of any other vehicles, especially that of ambulances and other vehicles in the service of health care. Bicycles and motorcycles may only be parked in areas designated for that purpose. On the one hand it is important because of the camera system monitoring the parking areas and on the other hand to ensure clear and safe pavements, entrances and stairs.
11. Access to the campus site by car or any other vehicle is at the owner's risk. Since the parking areas are not monitored, the University does not accept any responsibility for any damage (crashes, injuries, thefts, collisions).
12. Information on lost and unclaimed property is available at the Info Desk/ Reception at the main entrance of the theoretical building. Unclaimed property can be returned to its owner if the ownership can be proven, with a proof of receipt.

13. The security officer of the Medical School, as a functionary, is entitled to inspect the observation of Act No. XLI of 2011 on smoking in health care facilities in the protection of non-smokers in the campus areas including the buildings, common places, parking places, park, roads and pavements. His further task is to ensure the House Rules are observed and if any of these rules are broken he is entitled to remind the rule breakers of the importance of these rules and to inform the leadership of the school about the infringement.
